

HOPE Community Health Workers graduate with flying colours

In any profession, on-going training, practice and gaining of knowledge and skills are necessary for employees to function effectively and efficiently in their daily work. As a learning organisation, HOPE Cape Town places much emphasis on training for its staff and believes that it is critical for HOPE Community Health Workers to be proficient in the community healthcare facilities where they serve the public and for their work to remain relevant in the healthcare sector. To this end, HOPE Cape Town provides monthly in-house training on a variety of topics that focus on both personal development and professional development. The Community Health Workers are also encouraged to further their studies and attend the regular external training courses as arranged by HOPE Cape Town's Dr Ana Houston who is responsible for skills development.
